" Do you recommend mop with clear water travertine floors everyday, I mean is it ok? ―
Well, there's nothing really <i>wrong</i> with that: water can't damage stone. The real question is: how clean do you want your floor to be?
Oc cas ionally, if you use a plate to eat something dry, like a sponge-cake or something, you can clean it with just water. But if you use the same plate to eat, say, "chicken cacciatore― or "risotto ai funghi―, then I don't think that water alone is going to cut it, do you?
At least once a week – depending on soling conditions – the floor should be cleaned with water and a good-floor detergent rated "for stone― like MB-1.
" What is your advice regarding installing travertine bull noses to a swiming pool? ―
I don't see any problem with that.
