Hi We live in Sydney, Australia and are putting travertine pavers around our pool. We have had the coping pavers down for a couple of weeks now. Today we cut down a small Mango tree branch near the pool which put woodchips/sawdust on the pavers. It then rained. Tonight when we went out we noticed a yellow stain all over the coping pavers. Is there anything we can do to take the stain off? The remaining pavers for the rest of the pool area are going to be laid this week. We have also been advised to use an impregnating sealer for natural stone on them, which we haven't done yet. We were waiting for all the pavers to be down before doing so. Although I notice you are very against sealing them. Also can you advise how the remaining pavers should be laid. Currently there is a concrete slab for them to be glued on to.
