No cleaner or so-called stone polish will ever polish any stone, let alone black $\hat{a} \in \alpha$ granite $\hat{a} \in \bullet$, which is the most difficult of them all to polish!

Which also exclude the possibility that you could do it yourself. L

Unfortunately, if you're lucky enough to find a professional stone restoration contractor who knows how to face polish granite, that is going to be your only option.
