I have read your post about water rings on Black Galaxy. Is there a way to remove the stain (black) in the Black galaxy, (acetone wiped on the surface did not bring up any color). Dear B:

Acetone will seldom do anything. The "masters" of malicious doctoring have gotten so good that their "magic shoe-shine" is resistant to most solvent. It is not resistant to acids, though.

Soak it with a solution of water and phosphoric acid. That'll do it.
