However, since I'm concerned about putting toxic chemicals onto my countertops where people will be eating and preparing food my countertop currently has nothing on it (no sealer, etc.) but I know it needs to be treated in some way to hide the potential stains. Can you tell me what's in this stuff? Thanks.

MB-6 contains a special acrylic resin, which, like any other resin (acrylic or not) used to make color-enhancing products and/or impregnator, is a totally inert material after is properly cured (24 hours).

The carrier that takes the resin to the stone is mineral spirit and, once it evaporates, is forever gone.
