We have just installed travertine tile in our front lobby. After cleaning the grout dust off I noticed it is dull in some spots and shiny in others. Should I put a polish on first and then sealer? Or will the sealer smooth out the look? Thank you

Dear Ann:

First, stone is not polished by applying a polish to it, but by abrasion and friction, like gemstone. That said, travertine can'which will not polish.

Second, applying an impregnator (a.k.a. sealer) to polished travertine is impossible: its surface tension is so high that will not allow any impregnator in. In other words, polished travertine will never stain. It may "stain", but that \$#39s\$ another story and unlikely in a foyer environment...
