changed. The counter tops are just a little over a year old, they seem to be adequately sealed, and there is still a shine. I use a cleaner for stone (GranQuartz Stone Care Systems 113M) or damp cloth daily care. Wha is happening and can I lighten them back up or at least stop the process?
