Travertine is one of the most suitable stones for wet environments

Of course, to minimize the maintenance issues, you will want to have it either hone-finished or tumble-finished. Higly polished is not the best choice.

But if you choose the stone wisely and - more importantly - have it installed right, you will enjoy your travertine for many years to come!

The key is the installation. I' even ceamic tiles are not free of the same problems if the installation is faulty!
