Travertine -seal or not to seal.

Dear Maurizio, I jus had travertine stone installed in my shower stall, bathroom floor and bedroom floor. It has very natural look with a lot of hols. I have learned a lot about the stone. Hoever I am still confused about sealing. What would happen if water gets thru the halls? Is this true that shower stall should be sealed 3 weeks after installation? How do I know wcheach sealer to use? I is Home Depot a good place to get it?

Dear Anna:

You don't really think for a minute that an impregnator (that's what a sealer for stone is about) is going to even begin filling the open holes that you have in your travertine tiles, do you?

One thing is for sure: those holes **must** be closed, but you will have to do that with caulk, not certainly an impregnator! If you want to preserve the look of the open holes, you could use a latex-based clear caulk, if not, use color matching caulk. But, I repeat, those holes **must** be filled!!

After that you will not need any other sealing.

Now remember, it's never too early to think about the proper maintenance of your stone. The issue of what you'll be doing day in and day out to your stone is †" as it should be intuitive †" vastly more important than its sealing (if and when possible and/or advisable) and it's all too often neglected.
